The West Arnhem Regional Council duly elected Councillor James Woods as the new Mayor at the Ordinary Council Meeting on Wednesday, 20 March.

Mayor Woods has assumed the role from former Mayor Matthew Ryan who resigned from Council following his successful appointment as Chair of the Northern Land Council.

Mayor Woods has served the Maningrida community for over eight years as the longest serving chairperson for the Maningrida Local Authority.

Elected Members and Chief Executive Officer Andrew Walsh congratulated Mayor Woods on his appointment and look forward to working with him in the position for the remainder of the Council term.

At the Council meeting, Elected Members also extended their gratitude to the former Mayor, presenting Matthew with a special gift to recognise his dedication and service to the constituents of the West Arnhem Communities.

KINGAS MOVING AROUND



A burst of wild weather which included a cyclone late in the wet season has brought heavy rain and flooding across much of the Territory.

The Top End was drenched by monsoonal rains, storms left a trail of damage in coastal communities, and floods forced the evacuation of hundreds of residents from Borroloola to Darwin.

The weather eventually settled down, but the floodwaters made conditions on the ground very dangerous, one of the dangers being saltwater crocodiles are on the move.

Flooded creeks and rivers allow crocodiles to become more active with

high water levels make it easier for crocodiles to move about through inland water channels and move close to where people are living.

This may include a favourite fishing or camping spot.

When the crocodiles are moving about, they are also looking for food, a mate, and even a new territory to move into.

They prefer to swim, but can also walk on land for long distances to get somewhere if they want to.

Always remember that crocodiles are highly skilled and sneaky predators, who like to ambush their prey when they least expect it.

They can hide in very shallow water and lie under the surface for long periods of time.

They are camouflaged against the mud and will wait for an animal or a person to come close to the water's edge, where they are capable of bursting out of their hiding spot with great power and speed.

Stay safe after a cyclone.

Never swim in flooded rivers, creeks or drains, and always stand well back from the water's edge.

Help keep everyone safe by reminding them not to swim in flooding rivers and creeks and keep an eye on the kids at all times when they are near water or on the beach.

The NT Government is offering grants to support truth-telling activities and initiatives.

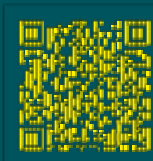
Applicants can apply for a maximum of \$20,000 in each grant round.

MINJILANG CRECHE BUILDING REPAIRS UNDERWAY



Work has commenced on repairing the Minjilang Crèche which is being completed by Stedman's Constructions.

The Minjilang crèche is a very important facility to all community members, which supports very young children and their families and carers.

The roof has been experiencing terrible water leaks over the past four years which resulted in the crèche temporarily closing in December 2022.

The crèche relocated to the school for a small period of time and then shifted to the community building. Unfortunately, this building was not viable so the crèche had to close.

West Arnhem Regional Council will begin to advertise for staff in the near future, so the crèche will be set to open with new staff onboard when work is completed.

This is expected to be done by 30 June 2024.

5 DIMENSIONS OF RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation Australia's vision of reconciliation is based and measured on five dimensions: historical acceptance; race relations; equality and equity; institutional integrity and unity.

These five dimensions do not exist in isolation, but are interrelated. Reconciliation cannot be seen as a single issue or agenda; the contemporary definition of reconciliation must weave all of these threads together. For example, greater historical acceptance of the wrongs done to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples can lead to improved race relations, which in turn leads to greater equality and equity.
