month, Aboriginal Investment (AIG) Group were excited to launch our fifth Remote Laundry in the West Arnhem community of Gunbalanya in partnership with the Adjumarllarl Aboriginal Corporation.

two weeks Within the laundry operation, has spun over 100 cycles, employed four staff and operated at 100% capacity!

Aboriginal Investment Group CEO, Liz Morgan-Brett says the project's success has been phenomenal.

"The beauty of AIG's Remote Laundries Project is in its simplicity. The laundry provides free washing and drying for the community to reduce the prevalence of scabies and other skin infections and improve health and wellbeing," Liz said.
"Since the first Remote

Laundry was installed, we've

ticked over 50,000 cycles, created 44 jobs and injected \$650,000 of wages remote communities.

"Within two weeks of operation, the laundry has spun over 100 cycles, employed four staff and operated at 100% capacity!"

Our partnership with the Heart Foundation has also helped us deliver education sessions on why healthy skin contributes to a healthy heart."

Independent AIG Board Director Lachlan McKenzie and Adjumarllarl Aboriginal Corporation Stronger

Communities for Children Coordinator says community is excited about the laundry's arrival and its impact on health and economic outcomes.

"Developed by the board of AIG six years ago, the Remote Laundries Project is a known and trusted solution to combat the burden of disease in remote communities while creating jobs," Lachlan said.

AIG now operates five

laundries in the NT: Milyakburra, Darwin, Angurugu, Barunga and Gunbalanya, with Borroloola, Nauiyu and Umbakumba next in line.

The Remote Laundries Project is supported by NT PHN, National Heart Foundation of Australia, Flinders University, Solar Living Homes, Katherine Laundry Gremlin Electronics.

INFO ON TERRITORIES STOLEN GENERATIONS REDRESS S

Sharing or reading this information might bring up difficult memories and feelings. There is 24/7 support available if you need help managing the emotional impacts of this information.

Stolen Generations survivors who were removed as children from their families and or communities in the Northern Territory or the Australian Capital Territory (before self-government) or the Jervis Bay Territory, can now apply for redress.

People can apply to the www. territoriesredress.gov.au in their own time until 28 February 2026.

The Scheme offers a redress payment of up to \$75,000 and a healing assistance payment of \$7,000. The Scheme also offers the opportunity for Stolen Generations survivors to have their story about the impact of their removal acknowledged by a senior government official, should they wish, and have it acknowledged in a written and/or face-to-face way.

Applicants do not need to have records about their removal to apply but may wish to share any documentation.

Free support services are available to help applicants throughout the application process - they can access these services even if they are just thinking about applying. The Scheme encourages applicants to contact these services to help them make a fully informed decision that best suits their personal situation.

Support to submit applications is available through local Link Up services.

Independent legal advice and financial counselling in relation to applications is available through knowmore Legal (www.knowmore.org.au). Service knowmore has culturally safe, traumainformed assistance on 1800 566 966 or 1800KNOWMORE. They have male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Engagement Advisors available in all of their offices.

If a member of the Stolen Generations passes away on or after the Scheme was announced on 5 August 2021 and they would have met the eligibility criteria, their family will be able to apply on their behalf.

The First Circles Leadership Program is an NT Government flagship program aimed to help identify, mentor and support Aboriginal emerging leaders from remote communities across the Northern Territory.

The program brings new voices, and quiet voices, to the conversation to ensure Aboriginal people from remote areas can confidently speak to, negotiate and influence the government about matters affecting their lives, their families and communities.

RAPID INCREASE OF SALT MARSH MOSQUITOES IN THE TOP END

NT Health is urging Top End residents and visitors to protect themselves from the salt marsh mosquitos as numbers are expected to increase, following heavy rainfall and high tides.

Elevated saltmarsh mosquitoes numbers can be expected between now and January.

Salt marsh mosquitos are aggressive biters that can transmit mosquito-borne diseases such as the Ross River virus and the Barmah Forest disease.

To minimise the chance of being bitten by mosquitoes people should:

· Wear protective light-coloured clothing with long sleeves, long trousers, and ankle protection with socks, in areas where mosquito bites are likely

· Use a protective repellent containing DEET, picaridlin or oil of lemon eucalyptus (PMD) and other mosquito protection devices as a supplement to protective clothing when outdoors in areas of mosquito activity

· Avoid exposure to coastal swamps and mangrove areas

· Use mosquito coils, lanterns and barrier sprays in outdoor areas and near the home to prevent mosquitoes from entering

· Ensure infants, children and animals are adequately protected against mosquito bites.

UPGRADES TO COMMUNITY ROAD NETWORKS

West Arnhem Regional Council has been carrying out extensive road upgrades throughout Maningrida, Warruwi and Gunbalanya over the last few months, greatly supported by the Roads to Recovery program.

The works in Warruwi are winding up and the community is looking better than ever.

The upgrades involved shoulder maintenance and resealing all of the internal community roads and all the edge breaks and potholes around town were fixed.

New steel grab rail bollards have also been installed on each side of the speed bumps on the internal community roads. These bollards were funded through the Warruwi Local Authority and will increase road safety.

These upgrades will add 10 years life to the existing road network in Warruwi and reduce ongoing maintenance improving road safety.

ABORIGINAL TOURISM GRANT PROGRAM OPENS

A new round of the Aboriginal Tourism Grant Program has opened to support NT-based majority-owned Aboriginal businesses and organisations.

It will enable them to develop their product and experiences to encourage visitors to travel and stay in the Territory for longer.

Minister for Tourism and Hospitality, Marie-Clare Boothby, said the Territory's tourism industry was a huge economic contributor, keeping Territorians in jobs and creating work opportunities for small to medium businesses.

"We are working hard to rebuild the economy, and we know that tourism is one of the Territory's biggest economic contributors," Ms Boothby said.

"Investing in Aboriginal tourism through grant programs enables local operators to develop cultural products that will attract more visitors and help our tourism businesses thrive.

"Deliver positive economic and social outcomes for Aboriginal communities.."

"The Aboriginal Tourism Grant program will ultimately see more cultural tourism experiences available to visitors and importantly deliver positive economic and social outcomes for Aboriginal communities."

Aboriginal tourism injects about \$383 million into the NT economy annually,

with many domestic and international visitors seeking authentic Aboriginal cultural tourism experiences.

To date, the program has supported 60 Aboriginal businesses with grants totalling over \$2.97 million.

The Round 8 of the Aboriginal Tourism Grant Program funding pool consists of \$1 million.

A minimum of \$30,000 up to a maximum \$100,000 is available to eligible applicants.

Applications close on Friday 7 March 2025, or earlier, if funding for the program is fully subscribed.

WARC ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING WRAP UP

The West Arnhem Regional Council recently convened for the September Ordinary Council Meeting, where key discussions and decisions were made to benefit the region.

Councillors received a presentation from the Local Government Association of the Northern Territory's President, Hon Kon Vatskalis, and Acting CEO Mary Watson, focusing on topics such as encouraging youth participation in local government.

The Council also received an overview on the NT Government's Remote Power System Strategy.

A significant agenda item was the approval of the West Arnhem Regional Council (Jabiru Town) By-laws 2024 for public consultation, which will run until 21 October 2024. These new by-laws will replace six existing by-laws, specific to Jabiru.

Council also approved the Funeral and Cemetery Policy, which will serve as an operational guide for the region's cemeteries under the *Burials and Cremations Act* 2022. This policy aims to

deliver culturally appropriate cemetery services for families throughout the region.

Council also received a comprehensive overview from the technical services team who have been busy delivering a large volume of projects, many supported by our Local Authorities, throughout the region this dry season.

In Gunbalanya, Local

Authority funded projects being finalised include the construction of rest area shelters and additional speed bumps at the office and youth centre and a cold water drinking fountain being installed at the Council office for public use.

Further upgrades to the Gunbalanya Oval are also progressing with resurfacing, line marking and irrigation works in the pipeline.

In Maningrida, the Maningrida Airport Road line marking is almost complete and the Maningrida changerooms have broken ground.

There are also many Maningrida Local Authority funded projects underway including new bollards going up at the Cricket Oval, the outdoor gym is nearly complete and the team are in full planning mode for the incredible New Year's Eve fireworks display.

On the islands, the Warruwi Hall reroof and upgrades are progressing and the Minjilang creche upgrades are now complete.

Council has also been working with the University of Melbourne's veterinary team to complete the region-wide animal management program for 2024, strongly supported by the Local Authorities, and bringing great benefits to pet health and wellbeing.

All Council meetings are open to the public, with dates and agendas available on the Council website.
