KAKADU TRIATHLON SET FOR MAY

The 2025 Kakadu Triathlon is set to take over the Jabiru Swimming Pool and surrounding residential roads on Saturday, 10 May 2025!

Online registrations are now open!

Known for its achievable distances, vibrant atmosphere, and community spirit, the Kakadu Triathlon welcomes participants of all ages and abilities.

Hosted by West Arnhem Regional Council, this special community event takes place at the Jabiru Pool, with the course along the township's residential roads.

In 2024, approximately 150 open and junior triathletes participated, raising over \$21,117 for CareFlight. Since last year's event, CareFlight has treated and transported more than 7,900 people in the Northern Territory.

MANINGRIDA AGED CARE SERVICE UPGRADES

The Australian Government is making further investments for regional, rural and remote aged care, providing \$12.8 million in grant funding to a service in Maningrida.

The \$12.8m will fund major upgrades and expansion of facilities at the Mala'la Health Service Aboriginal Corporation in Maningrida.

The Albanese Government funding is being delivered under the Aged Care Capital Assistance Program (ACCAP).

This investment is in addition to the \$2.4 million already provided annually to Mala'la Aged Care Service to support delivery of both home and residential care services under the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Flexible Aged Care (NATSIFAC) Program.

Works will include but are not limited to:

- replacement of old building stock and upgrades to deliver 4 new rooms with ensuites

- expansive refurbishments to kitchen facilities, including a new cool room

- delivery of a new laundry and storage areas

- improvements to staff amenities and a new care parking area

- outdoor improvements, including extensions to shaded areas and a new sensory dementia garden.

The Albanese Government continues to invest in aged care infrastructure grant funding at unprecedented levels.

Last year, \$385 million in funding was delivered under ACCAP Rounds 1 and 2, supporting 128 infrastructure projects nationwide – mostly in regional, rural and remote locations.

Minister for Aged Care, Anika Wells said, "The Albanese Government is investing record money into aged care so older Australians can better access aged care services in the communities they know and love."

"This \$12.8m will help create better

facilities for older Australians in Maningrida, building more home-like environments for residents and giving them access to comfortable, modern amenities and more liveable spaces."

Member for Lingiari, Marion Scrymgour said, "Our Elders and older people play an important role in our remote communities and it's essential they are provided the very best care and support."

"That's why I have worked hard with Minister Wells and the Albanese Government to secure this significant investment."

"This funding demonstrates our commitment to Maningrida by delivering important infrastructure upgrades to the Mala'la Aged Care Service."

REMINDER ABOUT NEW JABIRU BY-LAWS

This is an important reminder about the new West Arnhem Regional Council (Jabiru Town) By-Laws 2024 regarding animals in the Jabiru township.

Some penalties related to dog and animal management have increased, specifically:

- Keeping prohibited animals (such as cats and chickens); and
- Penalties for dog attacks.

Please remember:

Dog Ownership Regulations

- A maximum of two dogs per household is permitted.
- All dogs must be registered and kept under control at all times.

Prohibited Animals

- Keeping prohibited animals will result in high penalties.

Responsible Pet Ownership

- Ensure your dogs are registered.
- Keep your dogs on a leash when in public areas.
- Do not allow your dogs to become a nuisance through excessive barking or aggressive behaviour.

Council encourages all residents to familiarise themselves with the new regulations and appreciates the community's input and cooperation.

West Arnhem Regional Council (Jabiru Town) By-laws 2024 approved

West Arnhem Regional Council is pleased to announce that the new by-laws for Jabiru will come into effect on January 1, 2025, replacing the six existing by-laws for the Jabiru Town.

The *West Arnhem Regional Council (Jabiru Town) By-Laws 2024* were approved at a Special Council Meeting on December 6, 2024, and subsequently received the Minister's approval on December 17.

The new by-laws ensure the ongoing maintenance and regulation of the Jabiru Township. This transition marks the conclusion of a three-and-a-half-year journey following the cessation of the Jabiru Town Development Authority. The prior Jabiru Town Development By-Laws, which were set to expire on January 1, 2025, have been transitioned into the new framework. The drafting process began in May 2021 with numerous revisions and community consultations before finalising the new by-laws.

Some penalties related to dog and animal management have increased, specifically:

- Keeping prohibited animals (such as cats and chickens); and
- Penalties for dog attacks.

PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST MELIOIDOSIS

NT Health is warning Territorians and visitors to the Northern Territory (NT) to be on alert for melioidosis following recent periods of heavy rain.

In the past week, five cases of melioidosis have been notified in the NT. Since the beginning of the wet season on 1 October, 2024, 28 cases of melioidosis have been notified in the NT.

Melioidosis bacteria live deep in the soil. Heavy rainfall during the wet season brings the bacteria to the surface, increasing the risk of exposure.

Last wet season (1 October 2023 to 30 April 2024) there were 72 cases of melioidosis and five deaths reported in the NT. This compares to 87 cases and six deaths reported during the 2022 - 2023 wet season.

Melioidosis bacteria most commonly enter the body through cuts and sores, so it is important to cover and protect your skin where possible. Wind can cause the bacteria to be blown into the air, which can then be inhaled through dust and droplets.

Melioidosis often causes lung infections presenting with fever, cough and shortness of breath. It can also affect many parts of the body causing abscesses and sores that don't heal. Most people experience the first symptoms of melioidosis one to 21 days after exposure to the bacteria.

At this time of year, health professionals in the NT are on the lookout for possible

melioidosis cases, as it is important treatment is started as soon as possible.

If left untreated, melioidosis can lead to severe pneumonia and blood poisoning, with around 10 per cent of infections in the NT leading to death.

The risk of melioidosis is greater in those who may be immunocompromised by diabetes, heavy alcohol consumption (including binge drinking), kidney or lung disease, immunosuppressive therapy especially with steroids, and those with cancer or advanced age.

To protect yourself against melioidosis, it is important to:

- Wear covered waterproof footwear when outdoors
- Wear gloves while working in the garden or a soil-based environment
- Wash then cover sores and abrasions with waterproof dressings
- Wear a face mask while using high pressure hoses around soil and paths
- Stay indoors during heavy wind and rain
- Seek medical attention early.

Everyone, particularly those people with high risk factors, need to take action to protect themselves from melioidosis. Anyone concerned about having melioidosis symptoms should visit their local GP, clinic or hospital.

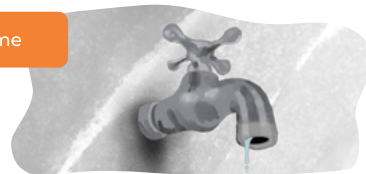

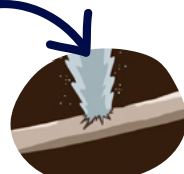
