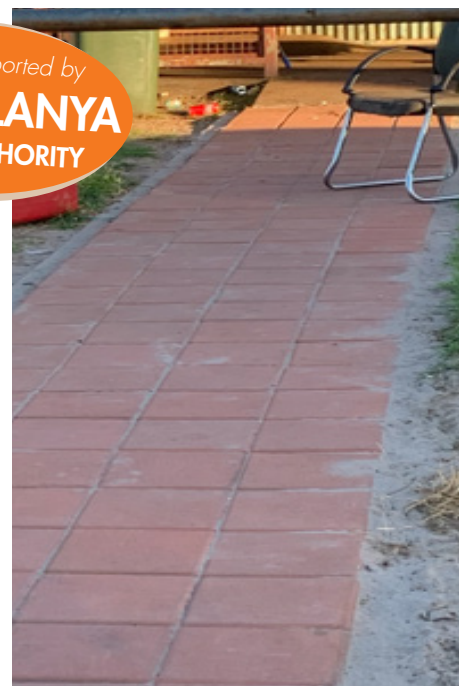
IMPROVING ACCESS FOR AGED CARE RESIDENTS IN GUNBALANYA

JOINING FORCES TO DELIVER HOLIDAY PROGRAM

West Arnhem Regional Council's Youth, Sport and Recreation team partnered with Red Dust to deliver a dynamic school holiday program that brought the community together through sport, creativity and culture. The program reached a total of 442 participants, marking a significant increase in engagement and demonstrating the growing community interest in inclusive and meaningful activities during the school break.

Weekly sessions focused on promoting social connection, physical activity, and cultural engagement, with a creative mix of activities including basketball, dodgeball, music workshops, cultural trips, and wellbeing beach walks. Despite working with limited and previously overused resources, the team effectively improvised to provide quality programs that were fun, accessible, and inclusive.

The collaboration with Red Dust added tremendous value, bringing in culturally rich and health-focused events such as:

- Community cooking and

barbecue days

- Strong Young Women self-care day
- Community engagement band night
- Welcome to Country and cultural storytelling
- Music and film-making workshops

Each event aimed to create safe, supportive spaces for young people to connect, express themselves, and build confidence, all while strengthening community ties.

"The kids are loving it, there's something new each week, and it's great to see them connecting, learning, and having fun," said one community member.

"Creating awareness for strong young women within the community," said another community member.

This program has shown that with collaboration, creativity, and community spirit, impactful outcomes are possible. Council and Red Dust look forward to building on this momentum for future programs that continue to support youth wellbeing and cultural connection in our region.

MICHELLE MARTIN TELLS STORY IN ENGLISH AND IN KUNE

My name is Michelle Martin. My skin is *Kamanj* and my clan is *Balngarra*. I live at *Buluhkaduru* when I'm not in Darwin or Maningrida.

My language is my father's - *Rembarrnga*, and my mother's language is *Kunwinjku*. I also speak *Kune*, Kriol and English.

I am now 62 years old. I was born in Katherine Hospital around 1963, and I grew up at Mainoru Station. When I was still small, around 1969 (seven years old), any angry *Balanda* (non-indigenous person) came and told us, "This is not your land. You people go away!"

So that was it - we left Mainoru. My father, mother, brothers, sisters and I set off and walked on foot, without a motorcar. We followed the road north to *Bigetti* (Bulman Waterhole), where we built a paperbark house to stay in. At *Bigetti* (Bigedi) there were many people living, and they spoke *Rembarrnga*.

Later we left and followed the river upstream where there is a road that goes to the old Bulman Station, which we used to call *Konjdjimb*. Today they call the area *Gulingulin*. It's country where *Rembarrnga*, *Ngalkbon* was once spoken, all the *Dakkal* clan - it's their country. The Murrays, Martins, Campions, Lindsays, Forbses, lots of us families grew up there together.

Mr and Mrs Watson were the first European people to come to Bulman. They were very, very kind people; they helped us in many ways. When they saw all us arriving, walking along the road, they came to meet us. Mrs Watson gave us food, tea, biscuits to eat. After that Mr Watson asked us, "would you like to work for me?" My father said, "Yes, that would be good." My father was happy, because he was making money.

At that time, around 1970-1971, they brought food from Maningrida. *Wamud* David Yirrindili and Mr John Hunter worked on this. *Wamud* (his skin name) brought the food to Bulman with a big truck. Mr Watson had built a small shop

name *Ngarridjdjan*. I call her *Mula* (my mother's big sister).

Ngarridjdjan saw many children playing, then she got the elders together under a bark shelter. She asked them "Would you like them to make a school here?" "Yes, good" they said, "so the children will learn how to read and write English".

Then they began organising the school. They brought a caravan and put it there. Two teachers came from New Zealand, Mr and Mrs Wells. They were very kind, and taught us how to read and write English.

Then in 1979 I went to Kormilda College. At that time I was 15 years old. I stayed there one year, then quit school. I didn't want to go back to school, because my family had promised me in marriage to Charlie Brian, *Kodjok* skin name, of the *Bunungku* clan. He came from *Buluhkaduru* to Bulman to get me with his motorcar and take me back to live there with him.

We didn't have a school at *Buluhkaduru*, but we had lots of children growing up there. So In 1982 *Kodjok* Charlie decided to speak to the elders about making a school. Just like at Bulman, many elders were happy about making a new school, because they wanted the children to learn

went to Batchelor College and in 1991 I completed Stage One of my assistant teacher course.

I started Stage Two but didn't finish because my little boy became ill and passed away. I was depressed, it really

affected me because I missed him so terribly. I just didn't want to do any more teacher training.

Many years have passed, and now I have many grandchildren. I do language work because I want our children to speak *Kune* language well, so they will know their culture.

That's it! I have told my story.
