MANINGRIDA FOOTY FESTIVAL

The Sydney Swans will return to the Top End this November to host a football festival focused on spreading an important anti-smoking health message.

Globally, tobacco kills more than 7 million people each year, including an estimated 1.6 million non-smokers who are exposed to second-hand smoke. First Nations peoples in the Northern Territory have among the highest rates of smoking in Australia, especially across the Top End throughout West Arnhem Land, where the town of Maningrida is located.

Last year, Swans AFL and AFLW players and staff came together with the local health service – Mala'la Aboriginal Medical Service and the ADF to host the first Maningrida Footy Festival, encouraging the community to Kick the Habit to maintain a strong body. The festival was part of the Australian Government's Tackling Indigenous Smoking

(TIS) program.

We're thrilled to announce that following the success of last year, the Maningrida Footy Festival is returning this November. The two-day event on November 15-16 will see participants from across West Arnhem Land come together to play football, share food and music, and learn about the dangers of smoking.

The TIS program supports healthy lifestyles through the promotion of smoke-free environments and discouraging the uptake of smoking and tobacco products. This year, the focus is on highlighting the impact of second-hand smoking on children and young people.

The festival will cap off a seven-day trip in the West Arnhem Land that will see a contingent of Swans players and staff visit Jabiru, Gunbalanya, Ramingining and Milngimbi.

Sydney Swans First Nations Strategy and Player

Development Manager Jarred Hodges said last year's event was well received and supported by the community.

"We're really excited to return to the Top End and work with Community organisations for a second year to deliver the Maningrida Footy Festival and assist in expanding the reach of current messaging about the dangers of smoking," Hodges said.

"Last year's festival was a resounding success, and it was an excellent opportunity for our players and staff to develop their understanding of First Nations Peoples' deep connection to country.

"We know our players can be powerful role models, so we are looking forward to working with the community to bring First Nations young people and families together to play footy and share some really important preventative smoke free messaging."

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The Maningrida basketball competition wrapped up with the grand finals on Friday, 24 October.

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FIRST CIRCLES PROGRAM CLOSSES TODAY

The Finocchiaro CLP Government is inviting Aboriginal Territorians to take part in the First Circles Leadership Program, a flagship initiative helping to grow future leaders, strengthen communities and deliver long-term certainty for Territorians.

"Through workshops, mentorship and education, we build leadership capacity, strengthen governance skills.."

Minister for Aboriginal Affairs Steve Edgington said the CLP Government is encouraging emerging Aboriginal leaders to apply for the 2026 program and take an active role in strengthening their communities.

"In our year of action, certainty and security we continue to invest in a program that provides pathways for leaders from our remote areas to lead their own communities, contribute to change and help shape the future of the Territory," he said.

"Through workshops, mentorship and education, we build leadership capacity, strengthen governance skills, and empower members to directly engage with high-profile leaders, community representatives, key services and organisations."

Since the CLP flagship initiative began in

2014, 122 Aboriginal leaders from across the Territory have participated. Eleven members from the 2025 cohort will address CLP Government Ministers in October, presenting their advice on policies, projects and initiatives that directly affect their families and communities.

"This program ensures emerging leaders can provide practical solutions to community challenges while gaining certainty and confidence in navigating public policy," Mr Edgington said.

The six-month program includes four face-to-face workshops and has been instrumental in supporting Aboriginal Territorians to deliver projects that address remote community challenges and provide practical solutions.

"The initiative fosters two-way collaboration and knowledge-sharing between government and remote communities as participants deepen their understanding of public policy and its impacts on Aboriginal Territorians," Mr Edgington said.

First Circles Leadership Program 2025 participant Selmer Smiler, from Kalkarindji in the Victoria Daly region, said she applied so she could inspire the young people in her community.

"After completing First Circles I am able to explore further training courses and opportunities that can help me have a greater impact in my community," she said.

MORE LIGHTING UPGRADES FOR JABIRU COMMUNITY

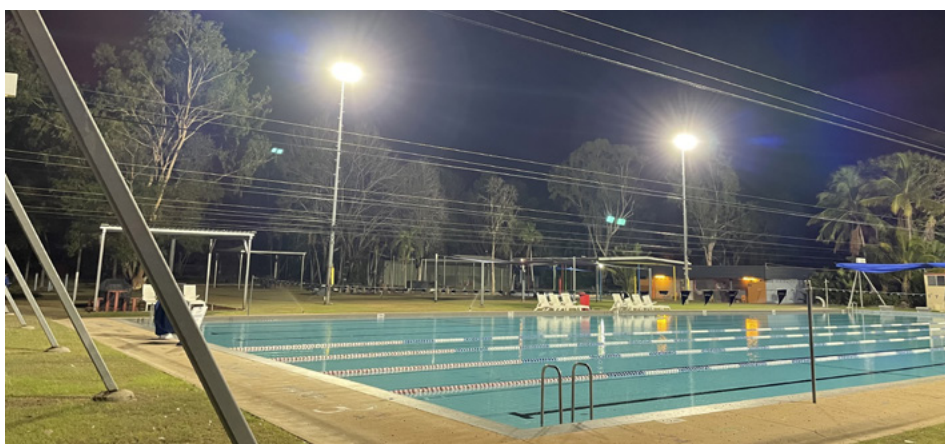
With the Brockman Oval light upgrades now complete, West Arnhem Regional Council has commenced further lighting improvements across the Jabiru township to boost community safety and visibility.

What is happening?

The 2025 Local Government Supplementary Elections be held to fill six vacancies after the 2025 Local Government elections, where there were insufficient candidates for the number of vacancies in the six wards for five councils.

Supplementary elections are required to fill one vacancy in each of the following wards:

What is the election for?

Voters will elect a Councillor to represent a ward. Local councils manage many of the everyday services closest to you like roads, footpaths, rubbish collection, libraries and parks.

Who can nominate as a candidate?

You can nominate as a local government election candidate if you are:

- an Australian citizen
- 18 years of age or older
- enrolled to vote in the local government area
- a resident within the local council area.

How do I nominate as a candidate?

To nominate as a candidate you must:

- download and complete the nomination form available at ntec.nt.gov.au
- be nominated by at least one other person enrolled in the local government area in which you are standing.
- provide a recent head and shoulder photograph of yourself.
- your completed nomination form and photo can be lodged in person at an NT Electoral Commission office or uploaded via the NTEC website at ntec.nt.gov.au
- nominations can only be lodged after the nominations open and must be submitted by 12:00 noon on Thursday 6 November 2025. Late applications can not be accepted.
- Contact the NTEC or your council office if you require assistance with your nomination.

BE MOSQUITO-MINDED THIS WET SEASON

Top Enders are reminded to be mosquito-mindful during the peak-population period from October to January.

Salt marsh mosquitoes are aggressive biters that can transmit mosquito-borne diseases such as Ross River virus and the Barmah Forest virus disease.

This announcement comes as NT Health sounds the alarm to look out for the menagerie of other wet season monsters: murky mud, menacing stingers, mango madness, and mean extreme heat.

The Northern Territory is home to more than 100 different species of mosquitoes, of which some spread diseases to people, pets, and livestock.

Diseases transmitted by mosquitoes include Ross River virus, which can leave you feeling achy and worn out, and more serious ones like Murray Valley encephalitis and Japanese encephalitis virus, which can be life-threatening.

To minimise the chance of

being bitten by mosquitoes people should:

- Wear protective light-coloured clothing with long sleeves, long trousers, and ankle protection with socks, in areas where mosquito bites are likely.
- Use a protective repellent containing DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus (PMD) and other mosquito protection devices as a supplement to protective clothing when outdoors in areas of mosquito activity.
- Avoid exposure to coastal swamps and mangrove areas.
- Use mosquito coils, lanterns and barrier sprays in outdoor areas and near the home to prevent mosquitoes from entering houses.
- Ensure infants, children and animals are adequately protected against mosquito bites.

HOME SECURITY

Reduce the opportunity for thieves to gain entry into your home, by doing the following:



LOCK your door – the most effective way to prevent thieves from entering your home.



Lock gates, garages and sheds when not in use. Lock all doors and windows, even when you are outside.



Don't leave valuables in obvious places. Thieves often target jewellery, in jewellery boxes on bedroom dressers and other valuables in bedside drawers and cupboards.



Keep your house keys, car keys and garage remote controls away from the front door or in obvious places. Thieves may use them to gain entry to your home or to steal your car.



Consider installing an alarm system, motion sensor lighting or closed circuit cameras.



Lock all garden tools and ladders away so they can't be used to break into your home.



Install security screens/doors and ensure they are key locked.



Make sure keyed locks are fitted to all of your doors and windows.



Use an ultra violet (UV) pen to mark property. Mark your valuables with your driver's licence number, prefixed by the letters 'NT' for Northern Territory e.g. NT123456.



Keep trees and bushes in front of doors and windows trimmed to avoid being used as hiding places.

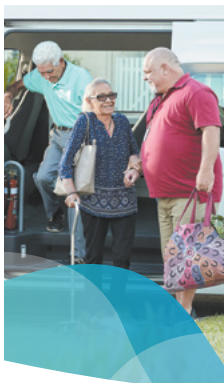
